# **About this Document**

This document provides instructions for registering a limited or extra-territorial limited partnership in Nunavut, pursuant to the *Partnerships Act*.

# **Submission Guidelines**

Be sure to read the document titled *Corporate Registries* –*Submissions Guide* (available from our website) so you understand the process, requirements and advantages of submitting your registration via email, and other submission options. The guide also explains how to complete the forms, and how to scan any additional supporting documentation that may be required.

Please consult the *Partnership Act Fee Schedule* for current fees.

## **About Partnerships**

A limited partnership is a special type of partnership in which there may be one or more general and limited partners. Limited partners cannot act on behalf of the partnership and usually cannot be held responsible for the liabilities of the partnership beyond the amount, which they have committed to invest.

Limited partnerships are normally established by a formal agreement between all of the partners.

There are no prescribed forms to register a limited partnership or an extra-territorial limited partnership in Nunavut. When registering a limited partnership, the registration certificate must comply with section 58 of the Partnership Act.

## Instructions

To register an extra-territorial limited partnership, follow these steps:

- 1. Obtain a certificate that complies with section 4 of the Partnership Act Regulations;
- 2. Obtain a certified copy of the registration certificate from your home jurisdiction;
- 3. Obtain a certificate of compliance from your home jurisdiction (if a certificate of compliance is not available, we will accept a letter from your company's lawyer confirming that your Limited Partnership registration is still valid);
- 4. Contact Legal Registries and provide a credit card number to which the registration fee can be charged.
- 5. Scan all documents as individual Adobe PDF (Portable Document Format) files at a minimum resolution of 300 dpi and email them as attachments to Corporate.registries@gov.nu.ca.

DO NOT INCLUDE CREDIT CARD INFORMATION IN ANY EMAIL CORRESPONDENCE.

Alternatively, the originally signed documents may be forwarded by mail or by hand to Legal Registries at the address on this page (faxed delivery is not accepted). If you are paying by cheque, the cheque must be made payable to the Government of Nunavut.
